What is Hunter Safety Training?

The program was designed by the Saskatchewan Association of Firearm Education (SAFE) to educate people involved in hunting and shooting sports, so they behave in a safe and responsible fashion, to instill in the hunter a sense of values and code of ethics that reflect the expectations of society, and to increase participation in hunting and the shooting sports as a way of life dedicated to the conservation of our natural resources.

What is PAL?

The Possession and Acquisition License is the primary firearms license under Canadian firearms laws. The PAL is the only license issued to new adult firearms license applicants in Canada; it is both required and the only permissible document for a person to acquire or permanently import a firearm. Anyone 18 or older may apply for a license once they have completed the Canadian Firearms Safety Course.

What is RPAL?

RPAL means a Restricted PAL, meaning the holder can also own and purchase restricted firearms like handguns and legal short-barreled rifles and shotguns. You must pass the PAL training before you can take the RPAL course.
